- Consider and assess, taking action where necessary to continuously improve environmental practice
- Promote awareness to employees at all levels for their own responsibility to the environmental well-being, giving training and information where applicable;
- Display and provide this Policy to all employees including Subcontractors working on our behalf and any other interested parties and initially on new employee induction
- Audit environmental and sustainability performance, and promote a carbon footprint initiative
- Aim to maximise the potential for the reuse and recycling of materials on every project and actively promote methods aimed at minimising waste.
- Develop our workforce and raise awareness of sustainability issues through our employees, supply chain and customers to ensure that our workforce is able to meet the future needs of the business.
- Encourage working partnerships and actively seek to influence policy both locally and nationally through our membership of various organisations, groups and working parties which are directly connected to our industry or our local neighbourhood.
- Work towards the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, adopted by all United Nations members in 2015, creating 17 world Sustainable Development Goals. They were created with the aim of "peace and prosperity for people and the planet..." – while tackling climate change and working to preserve oceans and forests.

The Directors, Department Heads/ Supervisors will be responsible for implementing this Policy and, as far as is reasonably practicable, ensure that:

- Material wastage is kept to a minimum and recycled accordingly and that recycling of materials is actively promoted.
- Continue to deliver products and services which have a low environmental impact across their lifecycle.
- Environmental accidents/incidents are investigated, dealt with and preventative measures are enforced to prevent further occurrences.
- Keep energy usage low. E.g. making use of low energy light bulbs throughout using schedules to ensure computers/lights etc. are turned off after work and to purchase products with a lower environmental impact.
